- Preparation of discharge summaries and referrals.
- Auditing, case presentations and seminars.
- Frequent performance of diagnostic and therapeutic procedures.
- Interpretation of ECGs, X-rays, CT scans ABG analysis etc.
- Assisting during performance of specialized and invasive procedures and independent performance including, Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (BLS/ACLS), Pericardiocentesis, Temporary Pacemaker Insertion, Diagnostic Gastroendoscopy and Haemo/Peritoneal Dialysis.
